A Message from Pastor Margaret....

Worshipping Together During a Pandemic

Grace and peace to you, members of Barre Congregational Church! What an extraordinary experience it has been the last three-plus months to have worship services from a distance and at our homes, something we never thought would happen! We started on March 15, and I remember writing to you in my sermon that morning, asking you the question the Israelites asked Moses in the wilderness, "Is God among us?" They were thirsty and there was no water. It was difficult for Moses because there was much complaining and quarreling going on, and the people of Israel were challenging him and testing God, to the point where Moses cried out to God and asked, "What shall I do with these people? They are ready to stone me!" They had been traveling through the desert for some time and were suffering the severity of the desert conditions. Their faith had been tested and their patience diminished to nothing. They were hungry and thirsty, and they cried for the pots of Egypt. Then we see how God showed up and miraculously provided water out of the rock at Horeb! Yahweh showed up!

From that moment in March onwards, it felt like a whirlwind for me as pastor, thinking, how are we going to keep our congregation together during a pandemic where we must stay separate from each other? How are going to do things, Lord, I asked like Moses asked God in the wilderness. Are You among us, Lord? Then the music came...through the sound of "This Little Light of Mine", sung by the Morin family, followed by the beautiful rendition, "Where the Spirit of the Lord is" by our organist, Deb Page, and more! Those who agreed to sing for us brought so much hope and light into that dark moment. It also opened up a whole new way of thinking about worshipping with one another via the internet. What a team effort it has been. In discussions with the deacons, our organist, and several other musicians and songwriters and family members in our congregation near and far, we were blessed with the most amazing music during this time. Everyone was willing to video tape themselves and provide us with videos to include in our worship services. Our deacons recorded their own readings on a weekly basis, and we gradually were able to put together full worship services with the help of my husband Jim Ault, who did the editing, so it would feel as if we were worshipping together. I made the shift from preaching from the pulpit, to preaching into my phone! What an experience! We have even been able to have communion together! You received these YouTube services via email, and they were posted on our website as well as our Facebook page. I thank Wendy Isgro, our secretary, Amy Trevett, who manages our website, and Janice Handrahan, who manages our Facebook page for sending out and posting our services. They worked diligently every week to get things done. Meanwhile the Barre Gazette requested that my written sermons be published in the newspaper, and that was an honor and a blessing for us.

While this has been an incredibly challenging and an enormous task at times to get everything done, and everyone learning how to do things virtually, I am so grateful for your patience as a congregation. You may be missing each other, as I do, but I hope you have felt blessed with what we were able to provide, and that you didn't feel like you wanted to complain (smile), and even if you do feel like you want to, the deacons and I understand that completely!

Meanwhile a committee had been put together to start looking at what it would take to open the church for worship services. This will require creative thinking and careful considerations to ensure the safety of everyone worshipping, and other groups using our church building. I ask that you all pray with us that we do things right for the good of everyone, and that when the time comes and we feel comfortable and safe worshiping together physically, that we will say, it is good to be together again. But before then, I ask that we all continue to come together in this way for a little longer, while our Committee is doing the groundwork for a safe opening.

I now want to thank God for helping us throughout this time, and for everyone who contributed to making our services so meaningful, and for sharing our services for others to see and read. These are all our deacons, Wendy Isgro, Deb Page, the Morin and Brown families, Kayley Clark all the way from Sweden, Julia Tuttle, Laura Guilbault, Karla Peterson, Jim Ault, Amy Trevett and the Barre Gazette. May God bless you all!

May we continue to pray to God for protection from this virus, and may you enjoy a beautiful and safe summer with your love ones. May we declare that God is with us, even though we are going through a dark valley still. Be safe and God bless you!

Below is a summary of the Zoom Church Meeting on June 12, 2020. The meeting lasted about an hour. Eleven people were present.

Pastor Margaret opened the meeting with prayer.

Bonni Holmes reported that our financial position is stable. Giving has continued using bill pay through the givers bank, Pay Pal on our web site, or mailing checks. We have obtained a PPP loan for our payroll for 2 ½ months. According to government legislation, this loan should be forgiven.

Church Committee report included:

Discussion of painting the west side of the church

Patching a leak in the steeple – cost within appropriated \$5,000 approved by the committee

Replacement of fire alarms and batteries by Houston Alarm Company

Allowing Food Pantry to do drive-by distribution from the church

Diaconate report included:

Collaboration to produce the video services every week for the church. They would like to thank Pastor Margaret and her husband Jim for the producing the video, Wendy for doing the bulletin, Deb Page and all others who have contributed music, and the deacons for their participation in the service.

New Business:

A committee was set up to formulate a plan to reopen the church. This committee represents Diaconate, Church Committee, Christian Education, Music Committee, Sexton, Pastor, Secretary, and moderator. We will explore the state's regulations, UCC documents, and plans from other churches to set protocols for the church reopening.
