Scripture Reading: Ephesians 1 v 3-14

I. Introduction:

It is our custom or habit maybe, to wish our loved ones and friends good wishes for their birthdays, anniversaries and other special days or accomplishments. We may say many blessings to you, or may God bless you, or congratulations and all the best to you. We do that because we care for them and want only good to be bestowed upon their lives.

II. We are blessed:

The letter of Paul to the Ephesians is called by some the treasure house of the Bible. It gives information to all Christians about the great riches that is theirs, and the fullness of life in Jesus Christ. It is a letter that makes one feel good, because it talks about God's goodness and purpose for us and the church in the past, the present and the future. It is written by Paul while he was in prison, but despite his imprisonment, he was filled with an inner peace and joy over the goodness of God through Jesus Christ. God's goodness and blessings kept him strong amidst all the struggles he was going through.

In verse 3 he talks about how God has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. They received those gifts and therefore as a community of faith they can now experience that deep joy and love that Christ demonstrated to them, among one another.
